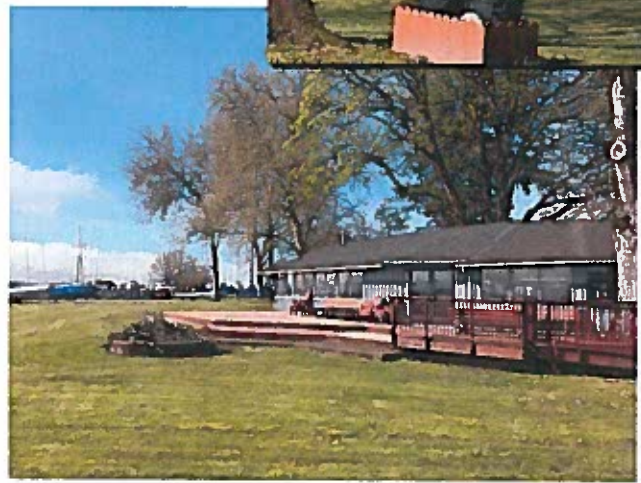

Stirring the Pot



What a complex organism a faith community is! Do you ever think about our church and all the moving parts, in different venues, working together (hopefully) toward the same goal and the same good? We take “three ring circus” to the extreme. And with the exception of your staff, everyone does their part as a volunteer, for the good of the whole.

It's no wonder that the apostle Paul likened a “church” to the human body:

The Spirit gives to each person gifts to be used for the body's common good. For just as one human body has many parts (members), they still are one body. So it is with our body of Christ. If the foot would say, “Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body,” would it's opinion make it any less a part of the whole body? If the whole body were an eye, how could it hear?

So it is here that there are many working parts, but one working-together body. The eye cannot say to the hand, “I don't need you,” or the head to the feet, “My task takes more training than yours.” Quite the opposite: the parts (members) of the body that seem to be weaker we cannot do without, and those very members of the body that not as important, we go out of our way to lift them up... whereas our stronger members do not need this!

*So now see this: you are the **body** of Christ working together, and yet you each are a valued **member** with a part to play. (1 Cor. 12 ff)*

That is the miracle of the church (our church, any church): so many working parts, gifted in so many diverse ways, and yet somehow the Spirit manages to keep us going in one direction.

I am continuously awed by the talent in our one church; so many members and so much talent. There are folks among us who do incredible things you will never see.

There are folks among us who lead visibly and so very well. But in the sociology of the Christian faith community, no one is more important because of the part they play. We have folks who in their professional lives earned their living by their skill and education; and yet for the sake of their church *volunteer* those same gifts so that *this* Body of Christ is fully functioning. Yes! Doctors, lawyers, accountants, musicians, pastors, engineers, builders, teachers, nurses (the list is endless) all give from the talent (education, work history) God has gifted them with to now gift *this* faith community.

And there are folks among us who lead quietly and anonymously. You may never see what they do, but our church is so much richer and diverse and fully-functioning *because* of their presence. We have folks

who silently wash the dish towels in the kitchen, and make phone calls and write notes to those who cannot get to church. I've seen those who will randomly show up to clean out a closet, or tinker with the sound system, help Bene in his work, or leave a treat for the office staff.

And that is who and what God gifts us to be: all working together individually and collectively. No one more or less important in how we function. The faith community, the church, is a level playing field, a well-oiled clock, a super healthy body!

So thank you!!! dear body parts! I learn grace from you each day in how you serve one another and our community. I see Paul's analogy of the *body* working in front of me, and am humbled at the myriad of gifts you give freely, for the good of this whole. I also fully recognize that there are those of you whom I do not see, precisely because you work when no one is looking so as not to draw attention to yourselves.

And thank you for setting the example to our new and younger members. They are learning right now by watching you. They are learning the art of how to give of their time and budding expertise without the expectation of return; but simply because this is how the faith community works.

Thank you for being the loving, living, healthy, talented, giving, and vibrant Body of Christ!

A Word from Pastor Adam



Soooo pastors are not supposed to play favorites! That is pretty much true in all things. It doesn't matter how many Sundays in the month you come to church. It doesn't matter how much or if you pledge. It doesn't matter if you cheer for the Ducks or the Beavers!

Your pastors are your pastors, no different from how we are a pastor to everyone else!

And pastors aren't supposed to play favorites in our responsibilities. In the United Methodist Church, ordained elders are called to a ministry of Word, Sacrament, Service and Order. We are not allowed to say "well, I just don't like offering Holy Communion." We can't say "I don't care what the Book of Discipline says about the Trustee Board, we're doing it my way!"

But I must confess, that sometimes I do play favorites. The sacraments - especially baptisms - are one of my FAVORITE things we do as a church. There are parts of our Book of Disciplines that I believe reflect our sinfulness and the privilege of heterosexuals. And there are some texts in our scripture that I read more than others. I don't read Judges as much as I probably should. I probably read Ruth more than its four chapters warrants. The Acts of the Apostles is one of my favorite texts to study in scripture.

Acts was likely written by the same author responsible for the Gospel of Luke, and it continues the story of community organizing that happens in the wake of Jesus' resurrection. Acts offers us glimpses of Paul's ministry, which we read more about in Paul's letters later in the New Testament. We have letters from Paul to the church in Thessalonica, and the Acts of the Apostles also gives us an account of Paul's ministry in Thessalonica. What an adventure that was! Paul and Silas were working in Thessalonica together, and while they had some success, the text tells us that their work "set the city in an uproar (Acts 17:5)."

I think "uproars" only happen, when the work you are doing is actually having an impact! And in Paul's second letter to Thessalonica he warns the community there "to keep away from believers who are living in idleness" (2 Thessalonians 3:6). Wow we don't have that challenge here at First! Among our many challenges, "idleness" is just not on the list!

This year you have been causing an uproar! You have been about incredible ministry to and with our neighborhood. Through the spring our backpack ministry to Cesar Chavez Elementary School, Thursday morning breakfasts, daily lunch bags and service with Food for Lane County, all helped make a difference in the fight against hunger in our community. We now have an amazing team of staff working with children of all ages with Kay, Sarah,

Sydney and Wendy building relationships with our kids and parents, and planning a great Sunday School Kickoff for September 10th. And now Sunday mornings and Sunday evenings we are connecting people with worship designed to inspire, challenge, and connect us - connect us with God and with each other in new and transformative ways.

Serving in the community. Providing opportunities for Christian formation for people of all ages. Faithful worship. Oh and did I mention that as of July 1st we are 100% caught up on our apportionment to the Oregon-Idaho Annual Conference?!? This is an incredible accomplishment! We are doing great ministry, and we are living up to our obligations to our denomination, thanks to your incredible generosity.

Last year we came to you with an incredible challenge, to: prayerfully consider how you might double your pledge to the church. Many of you did just that. Some of you couldn't quite do that, but increased your pledge. Some of you MORE than doubled your pledge. And some of you shared with us that you are doing the best you can. These are all faithful responses to a God who is calling us to be generous and sacrificial. Thank you, thank you, thank you!

It is because of your generosity, your faith in our mission - to make disciples, your faith in our vision - to work for light and justice in our community - that this year we are making a transformative difference in our neighborhood, across Eugene and Springfield, and through our apportionments you are advancing transformative ministry across our conference and the world.

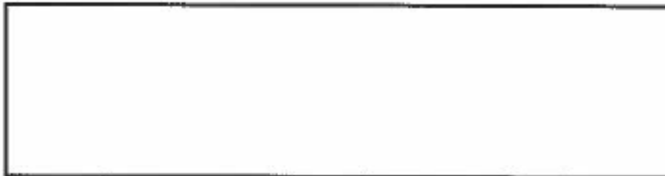

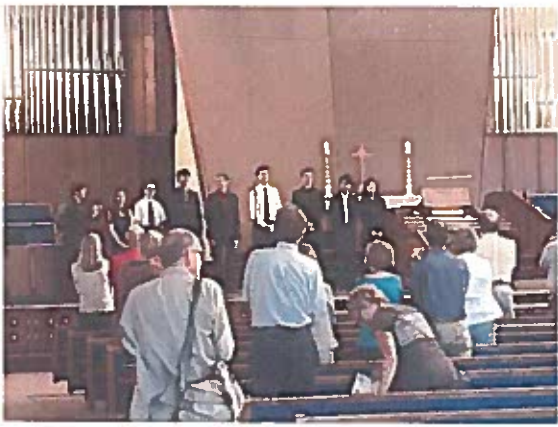
